Barton College is named for the late Barton W. Stone, who incidentally, was one of the primary leaders of the Cane Ridge Revival that occurred in 1801 in Cane Ridge, Kentucky. This revival was one of the most significant revivals of the Second Great Awakening. Several thousand were saved during this revival. Dealing with Root Issues

The Kernerman Multilingual Dictionary defines an exposé as “to uncover; to leave unprotected”. It is an unveiling. The Word of God promises that what is hidden will be revealed (Luke 12:2). In order to intercede effectively we need things to be uncovered...the veil stripped away, so we may deal with the root of the matter and not the fruit of the matter.

This past spring we had dandelions spring up. Some had not yet developed the seed pods, while others had devel-

oped them and were ready, with a gust of wind to scatter them all around. In order to arrest the problem, we developed a multi-pronged strategy. For those whose pods had developed and the seeds were about to be scattered, we would go to them, clip the seeds off just below the pod and dispose of them. Then, we would take a hoe, and dig the remainder up by the root. To only break off the stem would never solve the problem. It had to be dealt with at the root level. So it is with dealing with issues and sin...it must be dealt with at the root. For those plants that had not developed a full seed pod, we simply dug them up at the root and disposed of them.

However, it took more than one or two encounters with the dandelion demons to successfully root them out. We went out regularly for several weeks and eventually got virtually all of them. Occasionally one or two would show themselves and we would follow the procedure again.

So it is with intercession. Consistently dealing with the root of the problem will produce success. Cutting off the flower or the seeds, only restricted the growth, but never alleviated the problem. Remember this pattern as you pray...and may the LORD grant you much success, in Jesus' name.
